Class 1 have been learning all about rainbows in Science, they have even made their own. Year 1 have been to the woods this week. They wrote their own list of what they would like to take in their suitcases on holiday, had a scavenger hunt, fed the birds and had a lovely hot chocolate. In Maths, they have been recording addition sums in a pictorial form. They have also made some amazing Aboriginal paintings.

Year Two, have continued to produce their own version of the story, The Wind and The Sun. In Math's, they have been learning how to use the inverse operation, through pictorial images. Whilst in Science, they have learnt the conditions needed to form rainbows, and made their own. During Geography lessons they have been identifying key cities of the UK, and the distance between them. The children enjoyed having time, to demonstrate how to use the weather stations, they made for homework.

What a busy week in Class 3. They have started their new topic, Sounding Off. Starting with the poem, 'O, what is that sound?' by W.H.Auden; discussing the meaning, and who may be speaking. They can almost recite the entire poem using their poem map as a prompt; Mrs Provis and Mrs Evans have been impressed! Fractions have become more familiar for all, as well as decimal equivalents for Year 4. Their dragon inspired stained glass windows have brightened their room, what do you think as you look up at our classroom?

This week in Maths, Class 4 have been doing practise SATS papers. In English they have continued their persuasive writing about the Greeks. In Science they have started to explore Earth and space.

Medication in schools.

Over the past few months we have noticed an increase in pupils being sent in with medication. There was a change in the way that we handle medication in school which was in a newsletter on the 30th November. We have attached the information again for you so that you are clear of the process'. Please DO NOT send in medication with a covering note- You MUST come into the office and complete a health care plan.



Medication in Schools

Aspires procedure follows the DfE guidelines and Ofsted approvals.

"Medicines must not be administered unless they have been prescribed for a child by a doctor or dentist."

As a result of this, from immediate effect, we will be clearing out our medicine cupboard and returning any medication to yourselves. If you have a prescription medicine in the cupboard, Miss Hicks will contact you to come and complete the new forms.

Mr Ellis is able to consider the issuing of non-prescription medicine on an individual basis. A decision to administer non-prescribed medication must be supported with a health care plan which demonstrates the decision.

We can only accept prescribed medicines if these are in-date, labelled, provided in an original container as dispensed by a pharmacist and includes instructions for administration, dosage and storage.

The exception to this is insulin, which must still be in date, but will generally be available to schools inside an insulin pen or a pump, rather than in its original container.

We understand this is a change to procedure, but we must follow the DfE guidelines. Your support in this is much appreciated.
