



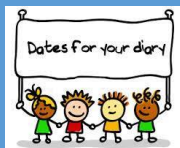

NEXT WEEK

In Class one:

- They will be looking at the world from a bird's eye view and drawing a map.
- Acting out and recalling the story of the three little pigs.
- Read, write and count numbers forwards and backwards.
- In R. E learning about the Creation story.

In Year two, they will be:

- Continuing their learning about the story of the Mousehole Cat by writing their own poem, for Mowzer the cat to sing to the Great Cat Storm.
- In Maths, they will be looking at, the place value of each digit, counting in halves and problem solving.
- They will be learning about the key features of Warbstow, using maps.
- In singing they will continue to listen and identify different instruments.
- Whilst in art, they will be discussing and drawing detailed images using their pencil skills.

Next week in Class 3 they will be:

- Writing about the water cycle and how rivers are part of that cycle.
- Recognising and naming physical characteristics of a river in Geography.
- To identify, represent and estimate numbers up to 1000 for Year 3 and beyond 1000 for Year 4.

Next week Class 4 will be:

- Developing stories through descriptive settings, this will be based on our local environment.
- In Maths they will continue to look at number and place value through Roman numerals, negative numbers and decimals.
- In P.E their focus for the half term are the skills needed for invasion games.
- In History they are delving into Cornwall under Roman influence.

This week we have been notified of a case of headlice in school.

Head lice are tiny insects that vary in colour from cream to brown/black. 'Nits' is the common name for the small eggs that are laid by the head lice. They are the size of a grain of salt, yellow-white in colour, and are found glued to the hair near the scalp. They are usually found behind the ears, the back of the neck and fringe.

To assist us in the prevention of head lice spreading, please ensure you check your child/ren's hair. If head lice or nits are found please treat immediately.
