



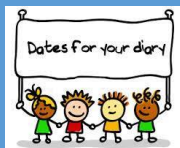

NEXT WEEK

In Class one:

- Children will be writing their own version of the three little pigs.
- In Maths, they will be solving practical problems for measurement (length, capacity, mass).
- Topic work will be designing wolf masks, recognising symbols on a map and looking at materials used for construction.

In Year two, they will be:

- Looking at a new Cornish folk tale.
- In Maths, they will continue to look at the place value of different numbers.
- Whilst in Science, the children will be designing a bridge, using their knowledge of materials.
- In the afternoons, they have the challenge of learning to make a sampler, and in singing they are learning a song about a cat.

Next week in Class 3 they will be:

- Explanation writing - Following on from learning about the processes of the Water Cycle, they will be explaining **how** the cycle works, verbally and in writing. A further challenge will be to include as many of the 10 spellings we're using for our topic as possible (Spellings taken from the Year 3 and 4 Statutory Spellings.)
- Also, they will be explaining why adventurers explore; why they go to the places they go, why they take the equipment, how they decide who will go and so on.
- For Maths, Year 3 will be continuing their learning and consolidation of place value and identifying, estimating and representing numbers through a range of reasoning questions and problems. Year 4 will be rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.

Next week Class 4 will be:

- Writing their adventure stories based in local environments.
- They will also begin to look at the vocabulary, and structure of poetry describing the moors.
- In Maths their focus will continue to be directed at Number and Place Value.
- History focus will shift towards the Norman conquests, with castles as the central theme.
- They will also be learning how to use and give 4-6 figure grid references.

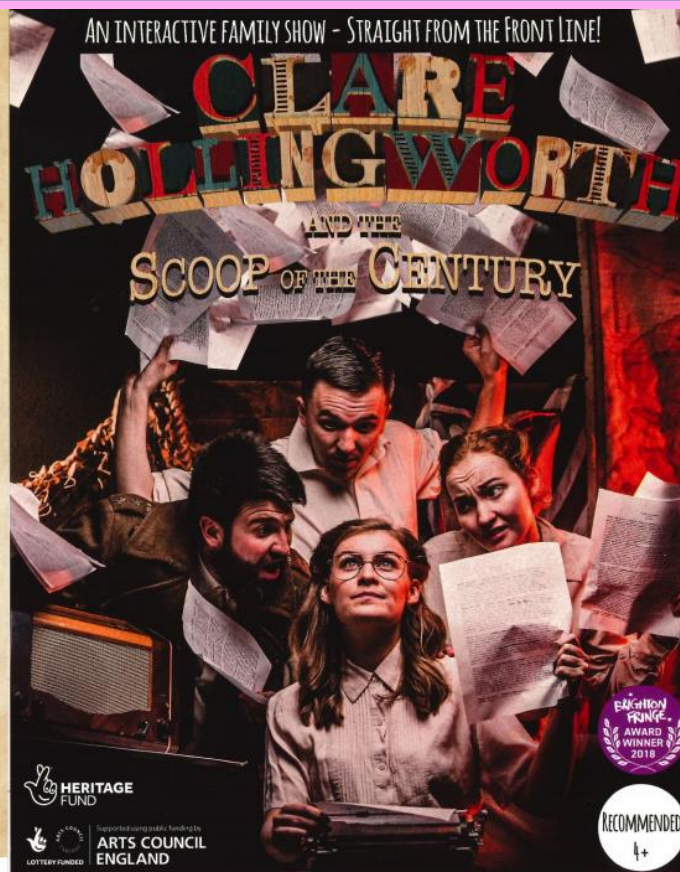
