



GARDEN CLUB PROJECT

A couple of weeks ago the children measured up the new flower bed in the front garden. As part of the club we will designing and building a whole new area. Ideas so far are: an apple tree; a small pond for frogs and birds to drink from; bee and Butterfly friendly plants.
