### In Class one:

- They have launched their new topic about Animal all sorts, and welcomed their new fish into class.
- They will continue to recognise and name 2 D and 3 D shapes as well as thinking about position and direction.
- In English they will be writing questions, and learning about classification through our topic.
- In music they will be sorting instruments and learning songs for the infant production.
- Class 1 were delighted to start gymnastics, and are eagerly looking forward to working on the apparatus next week.

## In Year two, they will be:

- Writing a report on the history of flight, as part of their new topic on Flying High.
- Whilst in Maths, they are learning about the properties of both 2D and 3D shapes. So, any extra help in identifying 2D and 3D shapes in their daily lives, would be a great support to their learning in class.
- During the afternoons, they will be learning about the location of Cornwall in relation to the rest of the country, and the wider world.
- In Science, Year Two will start to learn about the impact of friction of movement.
- In reading, they will be starting to look at how to answer comprehension questions.

# Next week in Class 3 they will be:

- Discovering more about Alfred the Great and writing a biography.
- Researching the Anglo Saxon's invasion of England and their settlements.
- Year 3 will be counting in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100.
- Year 4 will be counting in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 1000.

### Next week Class 4 will be:

- Delving into the age of the Ancient Egyptians.
- They will be exploring their culture, and beliefs as well as their historical significance.
- In Maths, the focus will continue to be addition, and subtraction as they look at solving multi-step, mixed operation calculations.

# **Reading at Warbstow Primary Academy**

Reading fluency and comprehension can be improved by teaching children specific strategies that they can apply to both check how well they comprehend what they read, and overcome barriers to comprehension. These include:

- prediction; (What do you think will happen next?)
- questioning; (Who is the main character? Where is the scene set?)
- clarifying; (What do you mean by that? Let me explain further)
- **summarising**; (What just happened in the text/chapter/story?)
- inference; and (Why do you think that the character feels like this?)
- activating prior knowledge. (What do you know already about this type of story/text/character?)

When reading use a mix of these strategies (2 or 3) each time you read to your child. Try and use a different variety each week.

Make a record of what strategy you used and how well your child did.
