Key Stage 1 Phonics Screening will be starting on Monday. This is a statutory assessment, and figures are published nationally with regards to children's attainment. We have been working in class preparing for these.

This week class 1 have started their new topic Animal Allsorts, sorting and classifying animals. In English they have been writing questions and in Maths they have been solving some very tricky problems. They had a great time in the woods making natural sculptures like the artist Andrew Goldsworthy.

Class 2 and 3 had a wonderful talk this week from Ben's Auntie Helen who works in Hollywood. She was telling the children all about the job she does with marketing films and that work started on the new "Top Gun" film last week!! She even knows Tom Cruise!! Thank you Mrs Northcott for sorting this out for the children.


Class 2 have been very excited this week as they started their new topic about Brazil. In English, they have been describing a carnival float, they would like to build, in great detail. This has been challenging! In Maths, Year 3's have been reading scales to the nearest 100,; and Year 2's have been describing position and reading scales on a thermometer. Thank you for all the topic related show and tell.

This term Class 3 will be learning all about the human body. They have been looking at basic anatomy of the human body, researching, chalking and sketching diagrams to show key organs. In Maths Year 4 and 5 have been problem solving using all four operations. In English they have been learning the key features needed to write poetry and linked art with English to make a Tagxedo each. Year 6 have been completing a challenge to plan and design a theme park. They have

Attendance

Last week the school had a visit from the Education Welfare Office and discussed the schools attendance which is gradually decreasing. As a result of this there are some new attendance regulations that the school need to make you aware of.

If your child arrives in school between 9.00-9.05 am your child will receive an L code (late before registration closes)

If your child arrives after 9.05 am your child will receive a U (after registration has closed)

If your child's attendance drops below 90% you will be invited to a meeting with Mr Ellis. In addition to this those that fall below 90% attendance, we will ask you to provide evidence of a visit to the GP. This can be in the form of an appointment card or prescription and doesn't have to be a letter from the GP. (Once attendance is above 95% again this will not be required.)

Letters will be sent out to all parents whose children's attendance is below 95%. You are able to check your child's attendance on the ESchools app which is updated every 24 hours. If you have lost your log in details, please contact Miss Hicks who will be able to re-print them for you.

This new procedure has been recommended by our Education Welfare Officer.

Thank you for your support and we value all your efforts to ensure your children come into school.
