There will be no choir next Thursday (21<sup>st</sup>) due to Miss Hicks being on a course. Class 1 have been writing and learning sea poems this week in Literacy. In Maths, they have been counting forward and back, in 1s and 10s

In Class Two, they have continued to write about the Town Mouse, and the Country Mouse. The children are now trying to use their skills to produce stories independently. They have designed, and written postcards using adjectives to describe the visit of the Town Mouse. In Maths, they are learning about the key features of 3D and 2D shapes. During science, they looked at food chains in relation to habitats. They learnt how this is the process of passing the energy for survival. In preparation for SATs in May, we have just started to look at past SATs papers.

This week in Class 3, they have continued to write poetic sentences, including similes, and considered the metaphor, 'If you are locked out, I'll give you the key' from the lyrics of 'One Moment, One People' as part of Sing Up Day. In Maths, Year 4 have been multiplying 3 digits together, as well as recognising factor pairs, and commutativity. Year 3, were solving division problems involving the 3, 4 and 8 times tables, and solving missing number problems. They have continued times table practise and are making great progress on our 'rockets'. Our enquiry into, 'What is good about Good Friday?' continues in RE.

In class 4, they have been learning how to interpret and create graphs using a range of features such as fractions, decimals, percentages and degrees in pie charts. In English, they have been learning to use hyphens to avoid ambiguity, and the impact of compound adjectives in news reports. In Science, they have completed their STEM project. They have also had the opportunity to take part in a drama workshop today, with the Bude youth theatre.

Thank you to the parents who attended the meeting this week at Pre-School, it was good to hear your views and I feel it was a productive session in planning for the future.

If you have any feedback for Katie off the back of her letter last week, please could you get this to her by Monday at the latest.

I would also like to say thank you to parents who attended the after-school parents consultation where the 4 school priorities were discussed. For those that weren't there here are the priorities.

- 1) Raise attainment in Maths, with particular focus on GDS (Greater Depth Standard) to at least in line with National standard.
- 2) To improve assessment and monitoring procedures in the school.
- 3) To raise attainment in EYFS and KS1 with particular emphasis on writing with boys.
- 4) Introduce and embed TIS UK school approach throughout the school for children, staff and parents.
