Hi all.

I am just wondering if it was well known that the fruit which the Junior children receive daily is paid for from FOWs (Friends of Warbstow school) funds? It is only the fruit that the infants receive that is paid for by the Local Authority. FOWs decided a number of years ago (I can't remember when), that rather than the Juniors losing the fruit as they did in other schools when the government funding got withdrawn, that the funds into FOWs from events would be used instead to

pay for it.

As such, around £20 per week is given from FOWs to fund the daily fruit that the Juniors receive. To make it work so cost effectively it has also been down to parent volunteers to go and buy the fruit at the weekend (or add it to their online shopping) and bring it in on Monday morning for school staff to prep and hand out to the Juniors.

We have been very lucky that there have been lots of volunteers over the years who have helped, but now we are down to only one person who has been doing it every week for over a year.

If we could find more volunteers again, then a rota could operate and make it much easier. Apologies for the long post, but if you would be willing to help, please speak to Gemma in the office.

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
