

Curriculum Statement

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As a school we have used the Inspire Curriculum to ensure that all primary subjects are covered in an exciting, stimulating and relevant way.

We were involved in helping the Inspire team to produce planning for mixed age classes.

We are at present actively engaged in a process of review, adaptation and change with these resources. We are taking the best parts of the topic-based curriculum materials and injecting increased Challenge, Higher Expectations and developing a strategy to enhance Long Term Memory Fluency.

The Warbstow Inspire Curriculum will be made up of 42 themed units, 6 for each year group. Each unit will be taught over approximately 6 weeks and will cross subjects so that children can transfer their learning from one subject to another.

We offer a range of after school clubs such as cricket, athletics, track, lego and choir. These alter each term so please look at our current list under Parents/Extra-curricular clubs.

On a Wednesday afternoon the Junior children are fortunate to be able to take part in some excellent music lessons. They are divided into 3 different groups and receive samba drumming, violin and cello, and singing tuition. Each term the children have the opportunity to perform the pieces they have learnt at our music assembly.

The school also takes part in many of the local sporting festivals and runs some events here at the school for other local schools.

Each year all our children from Year 1 upwards enjoy taking part in a residential. This is a very valuable part of the children's learning. The younger children take part in activities and sleep in the Community Hall; the KS2 children are offered the opportunity to go further afield to places such as Dartmoor and Bristol.
