Next week in class 1 they will be:

- Researching animals for their non-fiction book
- They will be counting across 100 in steps of 2s 5s and 10s

In Class 2:

- Will be learning how to write instructions.
- They will be comparing celebrations, at different points in time.
- In Maths they will be using their Maths skills, to problem solve.
- In Science, they are going to be looking at animals, humans and their offspring.

In class 3 they will be:

- Researching the 'understorey' layer of the rainforest to find out which plants and animals thrive in this part of the rainforest.
- Choosing a plant or an animal which lives in the understorey to focus detailed research, on which to base a poem.
- For Maths, they will be concentrating on solving problems involving fractions and decimals.

In class 4:

- They will be investigating reasoning, and creating their own problems for their peers to solve.
- In English, they will be focussing on storytelling based in the cramped confines of an 'Anderson shelter'.
- They will continue to design their own shelters
