Medication in Schools

Over the past week staff have been attending compliance meetings. Within these meeting First Aid, and our medication procedures were discussed. Aspires procedure follows the DfE guidelines and Ofsted approvals.

"Medicines must not be administered unless they have been prescribed for a child by a doctor or dentist."

As a result of this, from immediate effect, we will be clearing out our medicine cupboard and returning any medication to yourselves. If you have a prescription medicine in the cupboard, Miss Hicks will contact you to come and complete the new forms.

Mr Ellis is able to consider the issuing of non-prescription medicine on an individual basis. A decision to administer non-prescribed medication must be supported with a health care plan which demonstrates the decision.

We can only accept prescribed medicines if these are in-date, labelled, provided in an original container as dispensed by a pharmacist and includes instructions for administration, dosage and storage.

The exception to this is insulin, which must still be in date, but will generally be available to schools inside an insulin pen or a pump, rather than in its original container.

We understand this is a change to procedure, but we must follow the DfE guidelines. Your support in
