In class 1, they have been learning poems by heart. They had a visit from Mrs Shepherd's daughter Faye in an Ambulance and learnt all about 'a day in the life of a paramedic'. They have also been learning about arrays in Maths.

In Class Two they have continued to write about the Town Mouse and the Country Mouse. The Children have been looking at how they can improve their sentence structure to engage their audience. In Maths they have been applying their maths skills to problem solve using different types of measure. In Science, they have been learning about the human body. During the afternoon they have been completing art, using ever-day objects for their background.

This week, in Class 3, they have been comparing the language and vocabulary in real-life earthquake news reports and survivor accounts to begin to understand what it would be like to survive an earthquake. These ideas have been used to begin writing their own earthquake survivor stories. In maths, Year 3 have been drawing 2-D shapes and recognising angles as a property of a shape or a description of a turn. Year 4 have been comparing and classifying 2D geometric shapes, including quadrilaterals and triangles as well as describing positions on a 2-D grid as co-ordinates in the first quadrant. Research has begun into why earthquakes and volcanoes occur.

This week, Class 4 have been investigating area, and perimeter. They have learnt how to find the area of irregular and rectilinear shapes, and Year 6 have also looked at finding the area of parallelograms. In English, they have been creating engaging sentences and first paragraphs that grab the readers attention, through the use of different literary devices. They have continued to focus on balance and poise in gymnastics.
