Headlice

Unfortunately, it has been brought to our attention that we have an outbreak of head lice in school. Head lice are not a reflection of personal hygiene; they can only be passed on through head to head contact. The length of hair is not a factor. Parents need to be vigilant and check their children's hair regularly. Combing with a fine-tooth comb, available from the local chemist, is the only way to check. Comb their hair over a sheet of white paper and any live lice and eggs will show up. If head lice or eggs are found THE WHOLE FAMILY should be treated with a suitable lotion, you can get advice from your chemist. The instructions MUST be followed carefully. The most effective preventative measure against head lice infestation is regular inspection and combing hair with a fine-tooth comb. Please check and treat over the weekend. Thank you for your cooperation.
