- Please ensure reading books and reading records are in school every day.

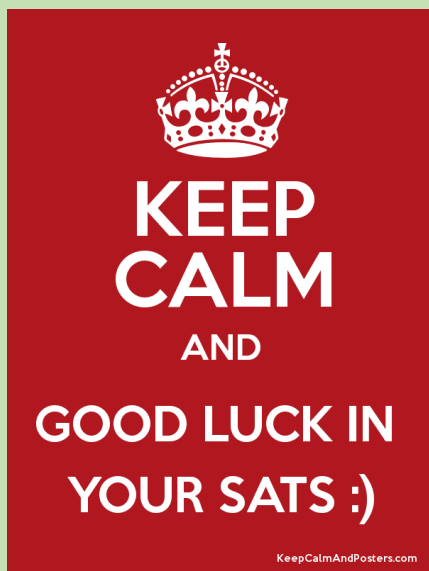
In class 4:
