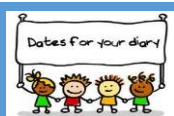

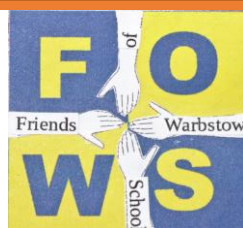

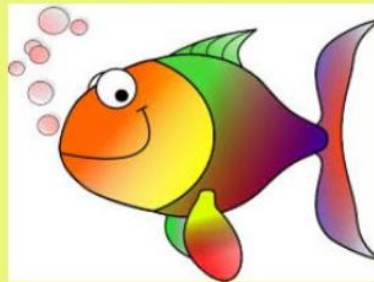

Family life can be difficult at any time. The Parenting Worker's are here to offer practical, emotional and friendly help.

From the delivery of an extensive range of parenting groups it became apparent that not all parents can commit to or require a 6 to 12 week programme.

For some parents this concept of a one day workshop will give them all the strategies they need to make positive changes at home. For some parents it will highlight that they may want to commit to one of the more intensive courses.

This workshop was developed to incorporate key messages, strategies and ideas using positive behaviour management with recognition that praise is a key drive in changing behaviour in children. Used consistently the positive relationship between parent and child is reinforced. Where difficulties are present in the parent child relationship it provides tools and ideas to change established negative behaviour patterns.

Workshop Objectives:

- ❖ To build better relationships with our young people.
- ❖ To develop strategies to support behaviour management.
- ❖ To give support and information to parents and carers.
- ❖ Supportive parenting will build healthy relationships with your child. It will encourage independence, with mutual respect and open communication.
