Thank you to all who have completed the collection of children form for the beach day. For those that haven't, please ensure this is completed as a matter of urgency

Beach collection

Reception-Year 2 please ensure are dressed in appropriate beach wear including suncream and hats. If it is cold, please make sure jumpers are provided. They may also wish to bring a towel. Flip flops are allowed at the beach, but please send in trainers, as they may be running around before the beach. Children are able to bring buckets and spades, please make sure these are labelled so we know whose are whose.

Key stage 2 please wear appropriate swim wear and beach wear for when not in the water. Again, flip flops allowed for the beach but wear appropriate footwear beforehand. Suncream, hats and a towel please. Wetsuits are allowed to be brought in if they are long ones. Wetsuits will be provided though so not a necessity.
