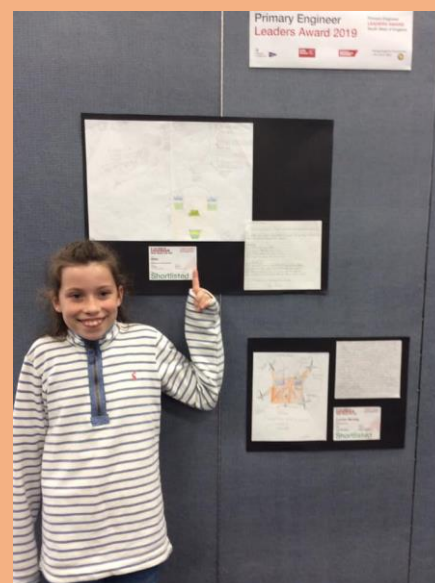
Over the weekend a new vacancy will be going live for a part time HLTA, to start with the team from September.
