What have your children been learning?

Class 1 have enjoyed working outside under the sycamore trees. In Maths they have been halving and quartering numbers, recognising 2D and 3D shapes. In English, Year 1 have been making animal fact files on the laptops. The class were all really interested with the birds of prey talk and Sharon was impressed with the children's questions and knowledge.

Year 3 and 4 have been off on their trips- please see the end of the newsletter for more info!

During the first half of the week, class 3 learnt about the respiratory system and have published their information leaflet for our display; about the body of science. During the second half of the week years six, five and two have been working together. They have completed a project on designing their

own island. They have been geographers, and decided the location of their island. They have been

explorers, and used all their senses to consider what it would be like to discover their island. Using descriptive language, and adventurous vocabulary to describe their setting, to a future tourist. Having discovered their island, they have then created a national identity, from national anthem to flag. The

children then became law enforcers. As law enforcers, they decided on the laws of their island, and the consequences of breaking the law. Friday they concluded their work by describing a new species, discovered by a visiting wildlife team. During the afternoons, we have been looking at the function of the brain, and making papier Mache brains, for an art display in class three.
